Course Description

The course is designed to improve students' Arabic writing, research, and argumentative skills through mentored completion of a final research paper in Modern Standard Arabic that is presented and defended before a panel of faculty at the end of term. Goals include improving fluency in reading and writing Modern Standard Arabic, enhancing accuracy of morphology and syntax, practicing oral presentation skills, and successfully writing papers according to standards expected for introductory courses at Jordanian universities. The program also demonstrates student's successful attainment of advanced levels of proficiency in writing. All program participants are required to attend their peer's oral defenses at the end of term. Course consists of 15 hours of individual mentoring, 20 hours of group instruction on research methods and formal writing and 100 hours of independent student work.

Course Requirements

Weekly exercises:

Students must submit a weekly exercise. The objective of these exercises is to illustrate that students can apply the gained skills such as using connectors, writing a resume, biography...etc.

Portfolio:

Portfolio is a collection of the student work throughout the semester. It includes functional writing assignments as well as structural and thematic writings that are assigned by the instructor.

Creative writing:

Students are required to submit 2 writings throughout the semester. These assignments aim to develop the student's creative writing skills.

Final presentation:

At the end of the semester; students get to pick one topic out of 2 options to present in a set of writing tasks based on their writing proficiency exam in ACTFL.
